Goa Tourism Advances New Initiatives

In June 2025, the Department of Tourism, Government of Goa, advanced key initiatives including urging taxi operators to join app-based platforms for transparent mobility, supporting shack owners' seasonal requests, and promoting eco and hinterland tourism under the "Goa Beyond Beaches" vision. National discussions focused on aviation connectivity and developing a concert economy, while local campaigns such as #GlowOnArrival, Ekadasha Teertha, São João, Chikhal Kalo, and International Yoga Day highlighted Goa's cultural and regenerative tourism identity.

Goa Pushes Hinterland Tourism

The Department of Tourism, Government of Goa, in collaboration with the Goa Forest Development Corporation (GFDC), is advancing plans to promote hinterland, eco, wellness, and adventure tourism under the "Goa Beyond Beaches" vision. The initiative highlights forests, waterfalls, sanctuaries, and eco-trails as key attractions, aiming to diversify Goa's tourism offerings, strengthen sustainability, and create regenerative experiences that benefit both visitors and local communities.



Goa Strengthens Concert & Connectivity

The Hon'ble Tourism Minister of Goa, Shri Rohan A. Khaunte, met Union Ministers for Tourism & Culture and Civil Aviation to advance Goa's tourism priorities. Discussions focused on developing the state's concert economy, enhancing experiential and cultural tourism, and expanding international as well as domestic air connectivity. Both sides agreed on coordinated efforts to bridge connectivity gaps and build a sustainable, globally connected tourism framework that preserves Goa's cultural identity while boosting accessibility.

Goa Launches #GlowOnArrival

The Department of Tourism has unveiled its #GlowOnArrival monsoon campaign, positioning Goa as India's ultimate feelgood destination during the rains. Showcasing misty hills, lush landscapes, wellness retreats, and cultural festivities, the campaign promotes regenerative travel through nature walks, heritage treks, yoga, and homestays. Running from June to September, monthly themes will highlight festivals, gastronomy, eco-adventures, and heritage, inviting travellers to rediscover Goa as a rejuvenating monsoon escape.

Socorro, 21st June 2025 – The Department of Tourism and GTDC celebrated the 11th International Yoga Day at Socorro Panchayat Hall with over 150 participants joining a guided yoga session led by certified instructors. The event, attended by the Tourism Minister, senior officials, and local representatives, highlighted Goa's growing focus on wellness and spiritual tourism while promoting yoga as a path to holistic health, mindful living, and sustainable tourism experiences.
